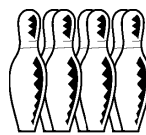
Celebrate The Gifts Of Women Sunday

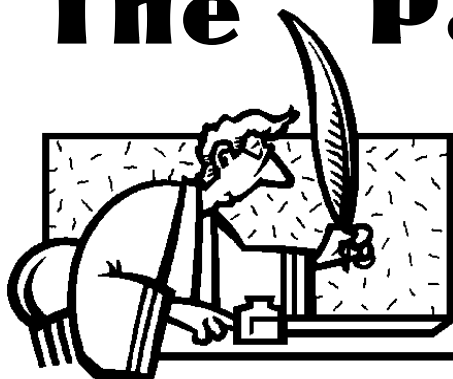

The Pastor's Report



To the members and friends of the Church on the Park,

And so we come to the season of Lent. Seems like it was just Christmas. I hope these words find you in good spirits pondering the last of winter and the arrival spring (at least in terms of the calendar).

I know that for some (and I include myself in this number)

March can be a difficult month - kind of an in-between time. So here at the church we try to make this month **as interesting as possible**. As we have in the past few years, we will be celebrating March as **Women's History Month** with several events. I would like to lift up to you our **Women's Worship** on March 19th which will feature **many women of the church leading worship**, a **liturgical drama** rather than a sermon, and a **drumming**. On the 12th I have invited **Katrina Hebb** into the pulpit to preach (she has picked a very challenging text from Romans), and I'm excited to hear what God will speak to us through her words, intellect and spirit. Finally, on March 26th, I will preach a sermon based on the book for our **"All Church Read"** which is Facing The Lion - "the extraordinary story of a poor nomadic boy in Kenya who literally travels across the world but never abandons home." **It promises to be a pretty eventful 31 days!**

I would also like to take the opportunity this month to **thank our Elders and Deacons** who have gone off the Session and Board of Deacons. While on Session **Karen McAuliffe** has given a great deal of energy and effort to the Resources Committee which she chaired for several years. This is the place where the wheel of theology hits the road of economics, and as such can be an extremely difficult place. She has brought a great sense of fiscal responsibility to the church and for that we are all truly grateful. **Marylou Scott** has gifted the Session with a great deal of sage calm when approaching very difficult matters. I have been especially appreciative of her work as co-chair of the Pastor-Parish Committee which functions as a go between, well, the pastor and the parish. Marylou continues to offer leadership from the organ bench each Sunday. **Rich Grayson** assumed a very important role on the Session these past few years by functioning as a bit of mentor to me, and when necessary, as a "governor" (remember those old trucks that had a *governor* on them so they would only go so fast...). Not an easy task I can assure you, but one at which he has done exceptionally well. **Shirley Norton** has been the "Go-To" person on the Board of Deacons for almost as long as I have been here. I've asked a great deal of her over the years and she has always responded with a gracious "Yes!" Shirley is a person who truly lives out her commitment to God, and is an outstanding role model for the office of Deacon. Last, but not least, is **Barry Walch**. Barry has been on this ride with me from the get-go (in fact, if you want to blame someone for me being here he would be the best one). His humor, insight and leadership is without equal. But the real beauty in Barry, and I'm not sure if everyone always sees this, is the sincerity and honesty of his faith. He has humbled me on more than one occasion with his simple expressions of spirit and emotion.

I would like to thank Karen, Marylou, Rich, Shirley and Barry for having made this church a priority in their lives. **These folks help us to remember that what makes each of us so important isn't what we can do, but what we are willing to do.**

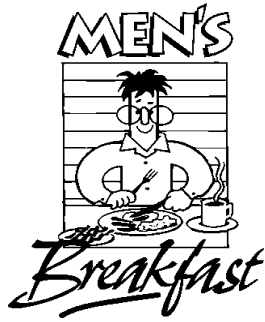

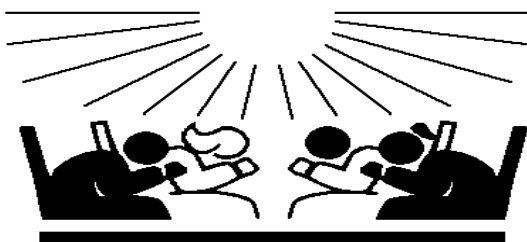
Presbyterian Worship

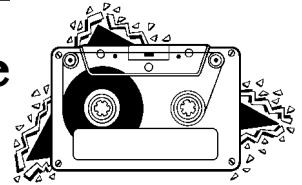

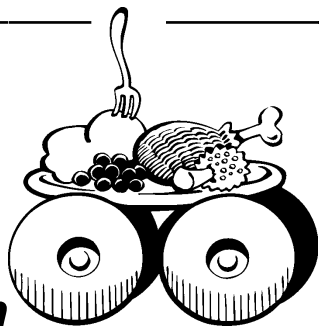

*"Jesus walked that lonesome valley;
He had to walk it by himself;
'Cause nobody else could
walk it for him;
He had to walk it by himself."*
