The Pastor's Report

Well, it is upon us: time for our annual Stewardship drive. All kinds of things have been churning in my mind about what I could or should say at such an important occasion in the life of our church.

Historically, our church has never embraced the hard sell. We aren't into guilt (thankfully!), and we don't come knocking on doors. But many people, including me, strive very hard to provide the members and friends of this church with the very best spiritual life we can attain: quality, thoughtful and even downright inspirational worship; pastoral care that is johnny-on-the-spot; preaching which is immediate, personal and doesn't shy from the hard questions; opportunities for thoughtful education and meaningful fellowship, ways to reach out in mission to our community as well as the larger world; and perhaps most important, an authentic, dynamic Christian community which maintains integrity over time. Given all of this, the annual stewardship drive is less a campaign and more of a reminder of what we already enjoy.

What is the value though, of this Christian community? Are the bricks and mortar, salaries and utilities costs, program and other operating expenses worth it? What is the significance of continuing to be both an authoritative, and a trustworthy witness to God's grace in the world? These are the questions each of us, as individuals and families, must ask and answer for ourselves. Everything else will follow from our answers.

In terms of straight numbers, this coming year will be the most challenging in my pastorate. The burden of supporting our church financially is increasingly falling upon the shoulders of those new to the church. I include my own family in this, as I know first hand the difficulty of sitting down with Linda at this time of year to make our own pledge; balancing the needs of the church with the reality of raising three children.

At the end of the day though, I know three things. First, that I am so very thankful to all of you for the support you give to the church, and to my family. Second, that all of you are doing the very best that you can. And third, that somehow our church *will* continue to honor the generations which have gone before us, while at the same time strengthening the foundation for those generations yet to be born, live and die in the nurture of this congregation.

Finally, I will tell you that my commitment to this church is absolute, and is second only to my family. I utterly believe that the hand of God is upon all of us, that we may do a new thing in this world for the sake of Christ.

For thousands of years, the most **widely used food** of humankind has been of such overshadowing importance that it has become commonly known as the **"Staff of Life"**. In biblical times, "Lot made a feast and did bake unleavened bread." It is thought, however, that shew-bread of the tabernacle was leavened bread as were the barley loaves blessed by Jesus when He fed the multitude in the wilderness.



For this service, **Tyke** baked two loaves of **Swedish rye bread** from one of her many cookbooks. One loaf for Rev. Mike to "break" and the other one she cut into cubes to serve the congregation.

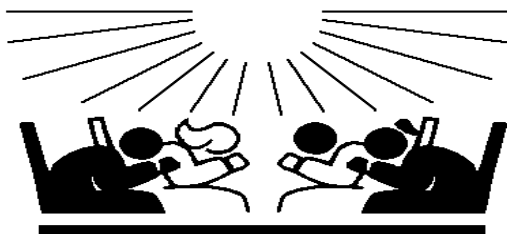
Presbyterian Worship

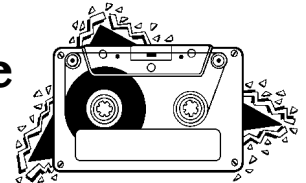

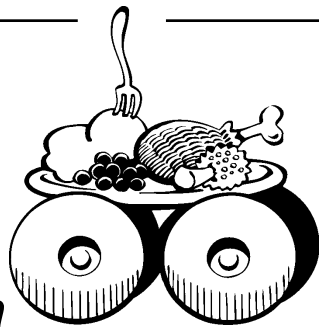

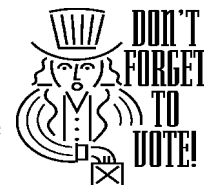

Session Report

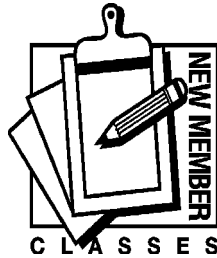
We celebrated the baptism of **Elias Paul Nelson** on September 18, 2006. Welcome little guy!
