The Pastor's Report

And, then, I remembered...how much fun this is.

Happy Fall to you brothers and sisters! Much has happened since last month, as we've resumed live-worship and launched our live-stream of the Sunday service. We typically push the capacity of our, now, socially distanced sanctuary at around 45, average about 18 streamers on a Sunday and garner 20 to 30 "views" every week from folks who watch the recorded service at their own pace. Amazing.

As you know, Stewardship time is upon us. YEAH! LOL. Seriously, though, this is crucial moment each year for our church when we "figure it out" fiscally. I hope each of you might sit down with yourself, or your spouse (as Linda and I do each year) and give serious consideration to what the church means to us, and the degree to which we endeavor to support the church.

More often than not, however, "Stewardship" kind of gets a bad rap. Really, though, stewardship is simply one of the ways we care about each other by providing ourselves the things we need to grow spiritually, be sustained physically and supported emotionally (and have no small amount of fun along the way). But, you already know all this. So, let me talk about something of which, perhaps, you are not fully aware. I know I wasn't.

This past week we undertook our first ever "Food For Fellowship" event. If COVID has taught us anything, it is the great importance of connection and community. To simply know, and experience, that each of us belongs to a larger, loving body. In providing a soup dinner to all the families in our church with young chil-

dren, a very clear sense of the parts of this body has been revealed. This past Tuesday we fed 103 people! More astounding, is the fact that we have 23 families in our church with school-aged children (88 souls) 50 of whom are kids. That's right, our church has 50 kids!

On the other end of the spectrum, we also provided meals to 12 folks who are a bit more homebound. In between, are 51 families or individuals who will be receiving cards from the kids who received food as away to "pay forward" the fellowship. Making all of this happen are 18 folks who made soup, baked bread, cookies and pies, donated cheese and delivered the food.

When you shake this all out, what this means is that we have a fabulous demographic at our church. We are mostly young families with kids (by *far*), we have a solid core of folks who step up to help to do the work of the church and, unlike many churches, are no longer the "bluehaired, gray-haired and no-haired" (not that there is anything *wrong* with that).

However, what these numbers fail to demonstrate, is just how much *fun* everyone had, and is having, making "Food For Fellowship" happen. At every turn people are *thrilled* to help, *delighted* to receive, *graciously* giving of their time, talents, energy and resources. Frankly, this has been the ideal of "Stewardship." Not just because of *what* has been offered but, more importantly, *how* it is *being* offered: with glad and joyful hearts. It's simply a whole lot of fun being our church. Let's not forget this.

Session Report

A regular meeting of the Session was held, via Zoom, on **September 28th**. Services at **Partridge Knoll** will resume in October. Work on the **fountain** is coming along nicely with new donations of \$6,500 bringing the current to **\$129,000**. Work on the **Greener Church Initiative** is ongoing.

Church Treasure, **Phil Elvy** spoke to Mary McGreevy about taking over the **bookkeeping position** and he is working with her to facilitate the changeover.

On September 13th, Rev. Mike gave a blessing at the **new C&CP building**. We are still looking for an additional C&CP representative.

Karen Bailey has been hired as the new church secretary. The *ad hoc* Committee on Reopening has prepared the sanctuary for **social distancing** and **disinfecting** in anticipation of **in-person services** resuming on October 4th. Rev. Mike will continue to send out a weekly sermon via email and the Zoom fellowship meetings will continue.

Beth Hayes reported that she and her crew made 376 cabbage rolls and offered 16 pies for dessert. Everything got sold and they earned \$1,384! Beth thanked her helpers: Amelia and Liam Rodee, Julia and Mary Basford, Katie Seymour, Olga Virgil, Whitney & Sophia Smalling.

WiFi is all set up for the live-streaming of the worship service. The **power** has been restored downstairs in the Christian Ed. wing at a cost of \$334. The search for a new **Church School Director** is on hiatus for the present as we cannot hold church school. **Master Sean** is holding **Tai Chi** classes in Fellowship Hall with great attention to social distancing and sanitation rules.

Session Report - Cont.

Rev. Mike would like to shift our **mission focus** onto **young families**. They are under a lot of stress due to Covid and could use our support. The idea is to distribute soup, bread, cheese and dessert to young families and to others in need. (Go to **page 12** to see how it worked out.) Rev. Mike also reported that all the outside decking and some of the playground equipment were re-stained.

Next meeting is October 26th.

It's Stewardship Time

Fall is itself a blessing for the North Country - beautiful leaves, schools buzzing with students, cooler weather and all things apple. It's different this go around as Covid has hushed some of our village jingle, but the blessings remain, each one of them sufficient. Among these are the loving and determined members of our church who, among many other things, have worked hard to resume in-person services with the benefit of a live-stream. Yes, we are now viewable on YouTube – **this Church knows how to meet a challenge.** It is a privilege, therefore, to have the opportunity to address all of you on the subject of stewardship.

We have another challenge; a yearly one, made more daunting by temper of the times. The passing suspension of in-person worship and the outlays involved in our new remote service, along with recurring costs like heating, outreach, insurance and repairs are again calling upon our generosity. November 1st is Pledge Sunday. **As Pledge Sunday approaches, we ask that you take a moment of careful prayer to search your heart and ask if you are giving as fully as you are able.** The success and very existence of our church lies directly in your hands.
