C&CP Usage

July = 203 households with 84 children, 187 adults and 148 seniors. Totals 419 individuals. Of the 203 HH, 3 HH were new to the pantry and 3 others were homeless or emergency food cases. **COMPARE to**: 221 HH last month and 201 a year ago.

August = 225 HH with 107 children, 221 adults and 164 seniors. Totals 492 individuals. Of the 225 HHs, 14 were new to the pantry. There were 5 cases of homeless people and 4 emergency food cases. COMPARE to: 203 HH last month and 232 a year ago. (Note: On Tuesday Aug. 27, we had 15 HH made up of 68 people come to the pantry. One family has 14 kids at home.)
