Time For Stewardship

Below are the words that **Patrick LaPierre** recently shared during worship in a "Second for Stewardship". Please consider what the church means to you and the ways you can support it on Pledge Sunday.

Good morning and happy Sunday! Thank you for taking time out of your day to gather at the Church on the Park.

Today is the week before Stewardship Sunday and I hope, in this short address, to focus on what we might contribute in the life of our church.

The LaPierre family arrived in Canton in 2007, kid-less and marinating in free time and general ease. We found our way to the church and were met at our front door, a week later, by Wanda who had a loaf of freshly baked bread. "It's my turn to give you the bread," she told us in that wonderfully straight Wanda way. Apparently, members of the church's welcoming committee took turns door-dashing welcome loaves and Wanda's name was up.

Subsequently, the Lapierre's had two daughters Daphne and Gwen, who have grown up in the church and have had the privilege of concerting with the interesting and loving parishioners here. I imagine many of you have similar stories and of course there are stories to come.

A church is a place where we find our way to God. It is also one of the few places where different generations regularly gather, where great questions are frequently pondered, and a place that offers structure to cope with grief and loss. To find a church like ours that does it so well is a blessing.

As we find ourselves at that time when we come together to show our support for our church by pledging monetary support for the year ahead, consider the physical needs to of the church, in which our past

sign outside. But consider too the church as a curator of memories. That's a mission too. So, let's be bread givers like Wanda in 2007 – generous, resolute and unforgettable.





Nature of

Church

Welcome home and welcome to it!

As ghosts and goblins give way to gourds and giblets, Stewardship time is upon us at the Church on the Park.

The first order of business is to offer **a** heart-felt thanks to all of you who have kept us "in business" this past year. Due to your commitment of time, energy, leadership and, yes, financial resources we have moved our church forward for yet another year. It is amazing and humbling to see what a (relatively) small group of people can accomplish toward the ends of bringing goodness, hope, and

bringing goodness, hope, and compassion to the world and our own lives.

And (SNAP!) just like that a *new* year is upon us and it is time once more for us to consider our financial support for our church in 2025. Stewardship letters have already been mailed out (and a pledge card may be found

in this month's edition) and this coming Sunday, **November 3rd is Pledge Sunday** when we ask folks to return their pledge of support for the coming year (there are Pledge Boxes in the foyer and sanctuary, or they can be mailed to the church at 17 Park St. Canton, NY 13617).

While it is hard, and in many ways unnecessary, to reinvent the wheel when it comes to the idea and practice of stewardship, I will tell you the nature of the vehicle which rides upon those wheels (i.e., the church) has undergone **significant change** over the span of the past couple of years following the experience of COVID.

It should come as no surprise that many (if not most) churches are struggling with financial viability, membership, and relevance. Thankfully, our church does *not*

number among them. While the size and nature of our physical plant/buildings means we will never have too much, **we always seem to have enough**. This, I have come to realize, is not by accident.

After 32 years in the parish I have arrived at the conclusion that ministry (stewardship included) really comes down to one basic thing: **taking care of people**. Everything else follows from this, or not. While the caring part has not changed much over the course of the past two millennia, the past two years have brought *great* changes

in our understanding of just who, exactly, constitutes the people. Owing to the live-stream, our well-read and utilized newsletter, weekly emailing of the sermon, and the nature of our society, a great many more people may (joyously) lay claim to "belonging" to our church in whatever way each person chooses to understand it. This is simply the

changing nature of church, both as a concept and as an expression. What I believe makes our church unique, is our ability to embrace the grace of this change.

In essence, we have allowed our church to be "customized" for use and participation to the individual resulting in **a sum** which is miraculously greater than our ever-diversifying parts. It follows, then, that each person consider their own unique role is supporting the church in a way which corresponds to the care they receive, how they receive it, and their own distinctive (and/or quirky) sense of belonging to the Church on the Park. I am absolutely certain that God has big plans for our church, and that each one of us will be

Brick Chapel Update

This brick church built in **1815**, located 4 miles outside of Canton on County Route 27 in God's country, is listed in the National Historical Society.

There are a few members who attend services during July and August, but all members have been canvassed and do not want to see the church closed. It has been difficult to fund payments for minister and keyboard player for those months. The Ladies Aid Society meets first Thursday of every warm month. The Society pays electric and security light bills. Due to the mature age of remaining members, no money raising events have been held!

During 2023, a local group of people in the community needed a meeting place and the church was located right in the middle of this community, so it was agreed to let these folks hold monthly Saturday night potluck dinners and conversation. They met in the church until cold weather dictated closure of the church until spring. Elliott and Mary Rodee opened Saphead Event Center for monthly potlucks. This group is very supportive of community and monetary donations were designated to pay for church expenses. Elliott and Mary handdelivered meeting notices which brought over 40 locals coming with delicious food and many donated dollars for expenses. Winter arrived and slowed attendance.

2024 has brought exciting news for Brick Chapel. Three new younger people wanted to be members and have joined the church-Peggy (Bullis) Shea, Mark Shepard and Mary Rodee. Donations earmarked for the church have been received in memory of Lawrence Aldous. A young man who grew up in Brick Chapel, attended church with Jan and Roger Favro has a strong attachment for his community, sent a \$1,000 check to

assist with expenses. A neighbor Masonic member, secured a \$500 donation. A bid is out for repairs of the steeple, wooden window and door casings need paint and there are rumbles about replacing the dining room floor! 
