The Pastor's Report Xo! Xo! Xo! Merry Christmas!

Jolly (somewhat) Old Rev. Mike here wishing you all a very Merry Christmas as we begin the Season of Advent.

Advent (from the Latin word adventus, meaning "coming") is the period of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus; in other words, the period immediately before Christmas. The Latin word adventus is the translation of the Greek word parousia, commonly used in reference to the Second Coming. As Christians we believe that the season of Advent serves as a dual reminder of the original waiting which was done by the Hebrews for the birth of their Messiah, as well as the waiting that Christians today endure for the second coming of Christ.

I know they never told me this at seminary, and I'm sure that none of you read the small print when you signed on as a follower of Christ, but one of the most significant aspects of being a Christian is the need to become one who abides well.

The definition of the word "abide" actually has two different nuances which really serve to capture the spirit of discipleship (i.e., what it actually means to "do" or "be" your faith). First, to "abide" means to accept or act in accord with the wishes or demands of another. Step number one in the faith journey is the acceptance of the fact that this path we are on is one which has been laid out before us by God. We, of course, may decide whether we will follow it (enter our old friend *free will*) but the direction, pace and terrain of the path is clearly not of our own design or control.

Due to my own sometimes tumultuous faith journey, I recognize and must constantly challenge myself to accept that there is a very real and pervasive mystical rhythm and spiritual flow to discipleship. The key is to dance (live one's life) to the tune God is actually laying down. As a former musician, I greatly appreciate people who get into whatever song is being playing, rather than wishing for a song that has not yet been played or won't be played. I think the same is true with abiding in whatever reality God is currently laying down. It is what it is: let us bide in it.

Second, we can also speak about "abiding" as a feeling or a memory which we do not allow to fade or become lost. For me, Christmas is the one time of year (whether I like it or not) that I get a vibrant sense of the actual "feeling of faith." We get it watching children take in the tree and presents on Christmas morning. We get it when you drop off a loaf of holiday bread to our neighbor. We also get it when we realize that Christmas isn't about what we get, but rather, what we can give to others. This feeling of faith is what it means to have God's son come into our world at Christmas, and into our lives every day.

In God's abiding presence, Rev. Mike

"Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me." - John 15:4

Session Report

Session met on **October 28th**. For the Treasurer's Report, **Barry Walch** noted that for the **first time** this year that \$5,000 has been requested from the \$20,000 budgeted deficit fund to cover bills. Rev. Mike shared that things are going well at the church and that he is visiting people in the congregation. He also noted that the Presbytery of NNY is struggling to maintain itself.

January 12th was set as the date to celebrate the gift of the grill from the family of **Bill Webb**. Two Presbyterian ministers, **Jean Kabambi** and **Leia Lutz** have been attending services. It was agreed to invite Rev. Lutz to preach the sermon soon.

An ad has been posted for the **director of music** position. Kathleen Crecco's last day will be November 24th. **Doug Wingerath** attended the session meeting to share his ideas about music for the church. **Patrick LaPierre** volunteered to speak to the music teacher at the church about possibly having students perform as soloists during the service. It was noted that the choir has returned to singing from the choir loft.

A discussion was held to create a **Congregational Coordinator** position for \$18,000/year. The minister's salary would be reallocated to cover the salary so that church would not incur any additional cost. Barry Walch and Jim Franklin will work with Rev. Mike on this.

The new **cabinets** have been partially installed in the nursery. **Furniture** is being considered for the **Selleck Room**. The **Cabbage Roll Sale** raised \$1,183 and the **Bazaar** brought in just over \$2K. The **Bean Sale** is this weekend.

Session Report - cont.

A **bridge club** has inquired about using the church for their meetings. Rev. Mike reported on the generous and anonymous donation to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund which must be used within the year. Thus far, **donations** have been made to the school's Back Pack Program, local ground beef for the Church & Community Food Pantry, rent assistance for a person in need, memorial donation for a family whose child had died, assistance for diapers for a young

family, one-time donations to the Crary Mills and Dailey Ridge church, and payment of a individual's bill at Claxton Hepburn hospital.

Nominating Committee will meet soon to discuss upcoming vacancies on Session. For **Steward**-



ship, letters have been mailed. Patrick
LaPierre presented his Seconds for Stewardship last week and Jim Franklin will share his at the next worship service.
Facilities Committee will meet soon to discuss needed repairs at the church.
Michelle Theisen shared that the Church & Community Program is doing well and has been providing personal care kits for the homeless.

Next meeting is November 25th.

Call to Congregational Meeting

The members and friends of The First Presbyterian Church on the Park are hereby called to a meeting of the congregation and corporation immediately following worship on Sunday, December **15th**. We will remain in the sanctuary so others may join the meeting via the stream. We will be considering the creation of a new staff position at our church entitled, Congregational Coordinator (approved by Session on 11/25/24). If this new position is endorsed by the congregation, we will correspondingly set and approve the Pastor's 2025 Terms of Call to reflect this new position. These changes, if approved, will not necessitate any increase in funding from the church but, rather, a reallocation of existing funds to be better utilized.

Prison Book Program

C&CP Usage

The **Session**, **congregation**, and **Rev**. **Mike** would like to extend great thanks to **Bob Duda** who has agreed to assume piano playing duties for worship beginning with **Advent** and until Dr. Meg is fully on board at a point in January. Bob has been **extremely gracious** in providing his ample talents and enthusiasm to see us through this time in-between pianists.

And, **YES**, Bob will be playing for the **Christmas Eve** service, which we all know is his most **favorite** time of the year!



Selleck Room & Nursery Update

Folks, it has been a **long haul** to bring this project to fruition. We still are not quite there yet, but we are taking some big, walking-on-the-moon steps and creeping ever closer to completion.

On Monday, December 2nd, the **coun**tertop, sink, and cabinet lights will be installed in the nursery. For the Selleck room, a large **5-piece sofa** surround has been purchased and will arrive by Christmas, as will the Foosball table which has already been ordered ("Tornado Classic" is the brand/model, tournament quality). Two **bean bag chairs** have arrived, as have the sound bar. subwoofer and **mount** for the **TV**. The TV is set to arrive No-

vember 27th, and at that point we can schedule the installation (hopefully in a week or so).



A comment about the decision to include TV in the Selleck Room. After consulting many folks in the congregation and having given the matter much consideration, the decision was made to have the Selleck Room provide the most potential benefit on the most occasions. While we aren't looking to have the TV on all the time (or even much at all, we are going to password protect its use) it will afford the opportunity for movie nights, CS instruction and other occasions/purposes. Given the large size of the room and the viewing distance, it will necessarily be a rather large screen (85 inches). As a bonus, the higher end sound bar and subwoofer will also serve as a Bluetooth connected "stereo" for more festive occasions. Once all these big items are on-site and in the room so we can assess remaining space. we will pursue other additions such as a soft-tip dart board, Nerf basketball hoop, board games, and lighting. Ideas and suggestions very welcome; see Rev. Mike.

Volunteers Welcome!


