We are just about there, folks. The **cabinets**, **sink** and **lights installation** in the **Nursery** are now complete. The large, five-piece sofa surround **sectional** has been delivered, the two **bean bag chairs** assembled, the **TV** and sound bar/sub-woofer have been mounted and are up and running, and the new **foosball table** has been assembled and is ready for play.

Now that we have a sense of what goes

where, we will be pursuing the purchase of a soft-tip **dart board** and Nerf **basketball hoop** for the Selleck Room, as well as lighting. We will also look to



install coat hooks in the short hallway connecting the Selleck Room (SR), Conference Room (CR) and Lorna's Lounge (LL). Final steps will be to cut and rehang the closet and hallway doors; and, to cut, paint, and install baseboard trim on both sides of the new wall. **There is light at the end of the tunnel!**

The Pastor's Report

Happy New Year One And All!

Here we go again, folks. Another year to love, laugh and give. Somehow, though, things seem *different* this year. I am not sure what it is but something is afoot...

Stop me if if I've told this story before. No, wait, it is a good story so just indulge me here for a moment as it bears repeating. Once upon a time, many years ago, a young minister was endeavoring to discern his call to ministry; should he stay or should he go? Perplexed, he went to confer with the Executive Presbytery who suggested the consideration of this question, "What energizes you?"

The past few months (going on a year, actually) I have been feeling ENERGIZED. At first I thought it was some prolonged manic episode or just a phase I was going through. At a point, though, I had to just accept this seems to be the new normal. Not that it is a bad thing, quite the contrary. It is, however, more than a little surprising. Yearly Christmas Giving & Mission Recap

Through our church's Mission Budget and special offerings this year, our congregation has provided around \$10,000 in mission funding in 2024. Some of this was for international work through the denomination, One Great Hour Of Sharing Offering, and the **Clint McCoy Feeding** Center in Malawi. We fund 25% of the budget for **MINC**, or Ministry In The North Country; a work within our presbytery to rehab houses and help farmers in Jefferson, Lewis, Franklin, Lewis and St. Lawrence Counties. As it does every year, a sizable portion of our Mission Budget went to the Church & Community Program to feed, clothe and tend to those in need here in our own community. We also supported the ministries of several small Presbyterian "sister" churches in our area, and provide funding to help fill their pulpits.

This year, our annual Christmas Giving Program has distributed over \$8,900 in monetary gifts to over **50** individuals and families primarily in and around Canton; none of whom asked for any help, but all of whom were sure glad to receive it. Of this amount, **\$3,300** went to families with young children, \$3,100 went to Farm Families, with the balance going to folks with acute need, illness, who have suffered an accident or misfortune, or are just struggling hard against very strong currents. The funding for the Christmas Giving Program comes from our monthly Deacon's offering, the Farm Family Offering, and a few additional individual donations. Envelopes are hand-delivered, with either "Merry Christmas" or "Thank you for all your hard work this year" written on the inside of a church note card. Occasionally, in return, we receive a thank you note which is deeply humbling in its earnestness and gratefulness. 2024

donations to the Farm Family Fund, saw a 50% increase in giving! Begun in 2002, over the past 22 years our annual Christmas Giving Program has provided over \$148,000 to *hundreds* of families at Christmas.

While the Mission and Christmas giving just described is something our church does every year, this past year our church again received a substantial gift to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund in the amount of **\$30,000**. With this our church is once again providing **50 lbs.** of ground beef a month for a year to the Church & Community Program's food pantry, purchasing all of the **fresh fruits** and vegetables for the "Bear Pack" program at Banford Elementary School for the 2024-2025 school year, continues to fund an **art program** for kids through the Canton Free Library, help with college and educational expenses. support environmental initiatives, provide financial support to smaller, sister Presbyterian churches, and provide **emergency assistance**. In the new year we will once again endeavor to purchase/ forgive medical debt owed by Canton families without health insurance (in process).

To date, this totals over **\$38,000** in mission funding *this* year alone, with approximately \$10k more earmarked for distribution. The majority of these gifts have gone to people and programs right here in Canton; but regionally, nationally, and internationally as well. Moreover, all this from a church with an operating budget of only about \$160,000. Which is nothing short of remarkable, I am sure we all would agree. We are an amazing congregation with glad and generous hearts! Great thanks to everyone for you incredible generosity!!!

Session Report

Session met on **November 25th**. Corrections were approved for the October minutes. The budget meeting was set for December 16th.

Thank you notes for donations sent by our church were shared from the **Dailey Ridge Church** and the **Holiday of Lights Committee**.

The **counters** will be installed soon in the **Nursery** and **furniture**, a **TV** and **foosball table** have been purchased for the **Selleck Room**. There is \$12,000 remaining in the Selleck Room budget.

Dr. **Meagan Dissinger**, Visiting Assistant Professor of Choral Music Education at Crane, has been hired as our new Director of Music. She will start with the first choir rehearsal on **January 16th** and the first worship service on **January 26th**.

The Stewardship Committee reported that **44 pledges** have been received. For the Nominating Committee, Michelle Theisen reported **Nick Dekay**, **Beth Hayes**, **JJ Jockel**, and **John Christopher** have agreed to serve on Session. **Georgia Vose** will return to Deacons. Barry Walch reported that **Doug Wingerath** has volunteered for the Facilities Committee.

Rev. MIke's **Terms of Call** were reviewed. A copy of Sexual Harassment Policy was given to Session members.

It was voted and unanimously approved to create the position of **Congregational Coordinator** which will be part-time at a salary of \$18,000. per year with pension benefits to be funded through reallocation of existing funds. A congregational meeting will be held **December 15th** after church.
