Reflections On Hospice

This December, **Rev**. **Mike** was asked to share his reflections and experiences on **Hospice** as part of a radio interview and subsequent article in NCNow:

In 23 years of ministry here in the North Country, I've officiated at hundreds of funerals. More meaningfully, though, is the time I've spent **with** those individuals and families as they, or their loved ones, journey through the last chapters of life.

From these experiences two things have become absolutely clear. First, there are incredible gifts to be both given and received at the end of life. Certainly, there is tremendous sadness and a great many tears, but also profound joys and laughter. Words are

said, hugs and comfort given, old wounds healed, new hopes expressed and families experience a unique bond which carries them not just through their current grief, but into the rest of their lives together. It is a profoundly humbling thing to witness. Second, the very best and easiest way to allow such gifts to be given and received, is to have the support of Hospice; and the sooner the better.

Every single experience I've ever had with Hospice has been not just "good," it has been **outstanding**. From the physical and emotional support, to the relationships that are formed with the nurses and volunteers, to opportunities that Hospice provides for families to care for and express their love for each other.

Often there are very few choices that can be made at the end of life, but choosing to have Hospice support you, and your family, is one of greatest gifts you can give to yourself and the ones you love.

Christmas Giving ReCap

Great thanks to the entire congregation for your tremendous generosity this year in supporting our annual Christmas Giving Program; especially the response to the Farm Family Offering. Our church was able to distribute \$7,000 of Christmas cheer to 54 families here in Canton and the surrounding area which includes \$1,500 for Farm Families. We are an amazing congregation with glad and generous hearts!

Stewardship Update

The **strong** and **generous** response to our Stewardship Campaign certainly proves that difficult times do often bring out the best in people. Currently, we have **55** total pledge units which include 11 units that have not pledged before and 11 units able to increase their previous pledge. This means the total pledged is **\$109,424** (\$101,022 for General Fund and \$8,407 for Mission). This compares to 2020 when we had a total pledged amount of \$94,616 (\$85,280 for General Fund and \$7,536 for Mission).


