

The Pastor's Report

A very Happy Easter to all, my brothers and sisters. Given the season, this month I'd like to take up the matter of "resurrection" as expressed in very concrete and physical terms.

Often, we understand Christ's resurrection as a spiritual rebirth in our lives and, additionally, as a corporeal return to life for those who have died in the faith. However, the notion of resurrection to new life is most readily apparent in the physical embodiment of the church.

Though many correctly understand "the church" to be the fellowship of believers comprising the body of Christ which necessarily inhabits some physical structure, it is undeniably true that the four walls and roof of such a church form the vessel for our fellowship and spiritual existence. A church is more than the physical structure, but the physical structure plays a crucial role in spiritual formation.

Undeniably, then, the physical structure of a church must be "resurrected" from time to time, to keep pace with the spiritual revitalization which is occurring within. While the physical state does not dictate the spiritual state, outward signs can be important symbols in indicating inward health and vigor.

Due to the pandemic, and the utility of worship through the livestream, many have missed that we have buckets, buckets everywhere this spring. We have leaks in the flat foyer roof, over the narthex which have soaked the choir room rug and the hall outside the sanctuary and,

most bothersome, in the steeple which recently soaked the carpet around the bell tower (and is peeling away the plaster that covers the stone walls). To these we can also add replacement of the south facing portion of the roof over Fellowship Hall. Suffice to say, there is much we must do this summer and in the coming years to "resurrect" the physical integrity of our church by maintaining and protecting it.

Along with this need for a "resurrection" of the physical church, and as a means of assisting in it, we have also been busy this spring trying to consolidate and better administer our church's restricted funds and endowment. A small working group comprised of Martha Cole (Elder on Session), Jim Franklin (who tends to our reserve funds), Mark Brackett (who previously had Jim's role), Janet Stitt (Clerk) and I have been meeting to review our current holdings and explore avenues for management. This includes meeting with a representative of the Presbyterian Foundation (where most of our funds are currently invested), a representative of the Northern New York Community Fund, and a local investment firm. It is hoped that a clear consensus will emerge, with recommendations then being made to the Session and congregation for approval and endorsement (respectively).

As we begin to emerge from the tomb that has been COVID, let us begin to venture out to the new life Christ's resurrection promises.

He is Risen, we are rising! - Rev. Mike



Fountain Restoration Update



Picking up where we left off last month, the fountain was delivered Monday March 5th to Robinson Iron in Alabama where restoration work immediately began (sandblasting, priming, and painting). In this process, it was discovered that the adornment are, actually, bronze, and these will be left to patina rather be re-painted.



Plans are to have the fountain returned to Canton in mid to late April. As of press time, a new pump has been purchased, and the template for the mounting bolts will be arriving March 30th (these have to be inserted into the concrete base). We are working with Robinson Iron, the Village of Canton, and contractor Tyler Locke to arrange a date for installation. Thanks to all who have supported this important endeavor!
