

The Pastor's Report

"I know that after I leave, savage wolves will come in among you and will not spare the flock." - Acts 20:29

Folks, I would like to use this month's Pastor's Report to talk frankly about the dangers (savage wolves) that we are increasingly facing these days as parents and church members in specific, and decent human beings in general.

I'm sure many of us remember warnings from our parents about not stopping to talk to strangers on the way home from school. This was a recognition of the dangers which have always been present in the world but, also, an understanding that at one time the idea of "home" carried with it an expectation of a certain level of safety and protection.

While the dangers of the world still remain, that safety we once all assumed about the sanctity of our own home has been utterly erased. With the advent of the internet, online purchasing and banking, email, smart phones and, especially, social media, those dangers once confined to the world outside our homes have now been invited right in and given access to the most intimate aspects of our lives; often without our awareness.

There is no more tragic example of this than the death last month of Riley Basford. A beautiful, trusting and spirit-filled lad just on the cusp of maturity and only just beginning to embrace the wonderful life which surely awaited him. All of that changed within just the span of 24 hours. Beyond the prayers and support we offer to his mother, father and family, one thing

we can do which would be the greatest tribute and honor is to speak to our children about the savage wolves that lie hidden behind the guise of false photos and identities; those who are automatically termed "friends." On page 10 and 11 of this newsletter I've included the homily I spoke at the celebration of Riley's life. I offer it to you as both a starting place and an encouragement to speak the children and young adults in your life so they may come to understand and trust there is no situation so bad that, together, it cannot be overcome.

Less bitter, but just as poignant, is the recent email scam which was send to many in our congregation by a person posing as your pastor (i.e., me) and seeking your help in providing gift cards for people in need. Please know that I have NEVER asked individuals for money, nor would I ever do so. There are plenty of avenues for the church and I to help people which provide a full accounting (Mission Budget, Deacons Fund, Pastor's Discretionary Fund, etc). Such a scam relies on two things to succeed: the goodness of the human heart (especially church goers) and the sense of urgency which the scammer hopes to create.

Some rules of thumb: SLOW DOWN, if you are feeling pushed to do something chances are there is bad intent. CONFIRM using a different source to determine true identity (call or text). DON'T GO IT ALONE, at first sign of fear, doubt or confusion, contact a friend or loved one.

Let's be good shepherds to each other, - Rev. Mike

Fountain Update

After many months, and too many years, the **metal fountain** in the park has been **completely refurbished**, **returned** and **installed** (April 29th) on the **new concrete**/**stone base**. Many were on hand to witness this "**watershed**" moment, and celebrate the milestone. There is still a bit of work to be done to create **benches** (repurposing some of the original stone), grade surrounding **lawn** and replant **grass** and, of course, connecting the plumbing and electrical services already in place. It is hoped that the fountain might be turned back on and flowing by **Memorial Day**; or, if not, by early June.





Also, we

are currently undertaking a separate fundraising appeal to raise \$14k to provide 8 new park benches, 4 wheel-chair accessible picnic tables, two singe garbage cans and two double garbage/recycling cans (\$6,100 raised to date). Further, we await final word on grant funding for tree removal (we've received encouraging indications). God continues to work in wonderfully mysterious ways to bring this important endeavor to fruition. Thanks to all who have supported the effort!

Riley Basford Homily

Matthew 18:1-6

At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who, then, is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" He called a little child to him, and placed the child among them. And he said: "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever humbles themself as this little child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes one such child, in my name, welcomes me. But whoever causes one of these little ones—those who believe in me—to stumble, it would be better for them to have a mill-stone hung around their neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea."

Riley K. Basford

Monday April 5, 2021; The Stables, Potsdam NY

Early this morning I was having my coffee, trying to wake up, and to face this day, and this very moment right now, which I have been dreading. I looked over to my wife and said, "This is about the *last* thing I want to do today." She said, "I'm sure you're not alone in that feeling." There are so many things to be said in suffering such a loss as Riley's death; so many and yet, at the same time, what could possibly be said to ease this searing pain and soul shaking loss? Especially for Riley's parents, his siblings, his grandparents, his aunts and uncles; but, also, for all of you who are his friends, classmates, and peers so new to this world. And, yet, there is more to be found here this day than the pain and loss which is so evident. There is also truth, and love, and, finally, there is hope.

However, before any of that, there is the matter of our anger; and lots of it. A teeth grinding, bone crushing and seemingly bottomless pit of righteous anger. There is nothing wrong with such an anger, but this is not a hole to inhabit for very long, and certainly not a place we should wish to make our home. Though it is certainly easy to allow ourselves to get comfortable with our anger, such a road leads us to nowhere; and, worse, prevents us from arriving at the destination we most deserve, which is a place of peace. Instead, let us take our comfort in holding God to the promise that for those who would cause one of these little ones, like Riley, to stumble, it would be better for them to have a millstone hung around their neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea. *(continued)*

That today's celebration of Riley's life should follow so quickly on the heels of Easter is, I'm sure, lost on no one. The promise of new life in Christ which Easter brings with it is, perhaps, too quick a turn-around for those of us gathered here. But, it is a gift that can be kept to open later, when it will most assuredly be needed. On this day, then, it is enough to recall this story of Jesus answering the question posed to him by the disciples of who is greatest in the Kingdom of God? Though each of them almost certainly and secretly expected and wished to hear their own name spoken, it is not the pious who come first in the Kingdom of God; neither is it the devout, or the powerful, or the famous, or the rich. Instead, it is the child in their midst who is understood to be first and greatest. And, unless we, ourselves, become as children we will never enter the Kingdom of God to which Christ, at Easter, bids us welcome.

I'm sure that for all of us gathered here today who are of a certain age, the message we want to impart to each of our children, grandchildren, students, nieces and nephews and neighbor-kids, is that for us, *you* are first and greatest in our lives. There is nothing we would not do for you. We love you more than you can *possibly* imagine; and, we *need* you to imagine all of the love we have for you. If you *ever* find yourself in a situation which makes you feel you are about at the last thing you'd want to do, *stop* and remember that you are *not* alone. There is nothing wrong with making foolish decisions, but find the wisdom to realize there is *nothing* in this world which we cannot overcome *together*.

In a few minutes, as we end this service, you will be invited to head down to the river and release a balloon in honor and in celebration of the life of Riley Basford. As you do so, I would also invite each of you to take a deep breath, exhale and to release even just a little bit of your sadness and grief, as you allow your love for Riley, and your wonderful memories of him, to lighten the load you are carrying if only ever so slightly. And, tomorrow, find a way to support each other in doing so again, and again, and again. In the days ahead and the time to come, the journey we will need to take together will not be made in leaps and bounds but, most probably, in the inches measured by hugs, laughter and the gentleness we offer to each other and, especially, to ourselves. And Jesus said, "Let the little children come unto me, and suffer them not, for to such as these belong the Kingdom of God." Amen.
