The Pastor's Report

Howdy folks. I trust that these words find you all well and, more than just "surviving" are making strides toward to "thriving." Fall is fully upon us, the colors are changing and there is quite a little nip in the air these days.

Feels a little crazy to me that we've got Halloween on the horizon, but there it is. Actually, there is an awful lot that feels a little crazy these days, doesn't it? We've certainly found new meaning to Paul Simon's song, "Still Crazy After All These Years." Though, not necessarily in the best of ways.

Linda and I very much enjoyed our extended time off, with much relaxing, reflection and rest tak-

ing place. I did get over a big hump with the "She Shack" (no, it isn't *done*) but progress is certainly being made (slow and steady wins the race). We also enjoyed a fabulous weekend at New Jersey's Long Beach Island, with terrific weather, delicious food and a great deal of love shared and long-standing friendships strengthened. I even managed to get Linda out of bed to watch the

sunrise over the Atlantic Ocean; quite a treat.

Though I was certainly ready to return to work with a renewed vigor (and I have) I must confess to being a little frustrated at the realization that things are *still* not how I wish them to be. Of course, this isn't necessarily a shock. It seems, though, that a few weeks away cleared my vision as to just how far we still have to go to get past COVID and the unfortunate changes and compromises it has brought to each of us and our world.

I'm sure I'm not telling anybody anything new, especially if you are the parent of school-aged children. It is beyond my ability to comprehend the terrible burden this has placed on folks, just putting kids on the bus or dropping them off at school each day. Frankly, I truly fear for our kids regarding the stress they are living under and the opportunities and normal childhood experiences which are being thwarted or delayed. I am profoundly missing seeing the children of our church,



and having the privilege of being even a small part of their lives.

Such is the context out of which I write this month's Pastor's report. I've been made to consider life's gains and losses and how either/both of these come to define us and our lives. Certainly in terms of our experience of COVID, but it a more comprehensive manner especially.

Frankly, I'd like to see the glass half full on this, and certainly we can and should do so. There is much we have learned about ourselves, our families and our church these past two years as we've picked ourselves up and dusted ourselves off time

> and time again. There is also much we learn about life in the big picture when we suffer loss. But, my Lord, these are difficult and unwanted lessons to learn in spite of the good gains that can, and often do, result from such experiences.

I share this to remind you (and myself) that though we cannot necessary always control the gains and

losses, we do hold sway over the lessons they teach us, the impact they have on us and the responses we offer in return.

As you will see in this newsletter, we are undertaking a **Great Pumpkin Parade** later this month in conjunction with our Fall Food for Fellowship event. While an admittedly modest endeavor, one small candle(s) in the dark as it were, such an undertaking is both an act of defiance against that which would seek to overwhelm us, and a celebration of who and what we remain to be and dream of always becoming: a community of faith determined to move past fear and frustration to claim celebration and joy as the means to carry us through these dark and scary times. So, pick up your pumpkin and get to carving out a place for your light to shine upon the world, those you love and, especially, yourself.

Park Update

Having completed the **restoration** of the **fountain**, we are now moving on to the the long overdue **tree work** in the park. Funded by a **NYS DEC grant** and a match by the **Town of Canton**, work will soon begin to remove **dead** and **dying trees**, as well as the **pruning** and care of remaining trees.

We will also be treating one of the **Ash trees** in the park (rather than preemptively removing) to fend off **Emerald Ash Borer infestation** (recently discovered in nearby Potsdam); as well as establishing a **funded plan** with the Village of Canton to carry out the work for the next **30 years**.


This work should be completed by the **end of October**, though all trees will be **aer-ated** and **fertilized** (and Ash tree inoculated) in the spring as is the **best practice**. Once the trees have been pruned or removed/stumped, during the first week of No-vember, **St. Lawrence County Soil and Water** and the Village of Canton will cooperatively plant **13 new trees** (there was a thought to do more, but the decision was reached to maintain some open/sunlit spaces instead). New species will include "**Cucumber**" tree (in the Magnolia family), **White Oak**, **Coffeetree**, **Hackberry**, **Northern Catalpa** and **Black Gum**.

Welcome Great Pumpkin


