The Pastor's Report

Greetings! I trust everyone enjoyed a fine and festive Christmas with family and feasting. Hopefully Santa was able to bring you just the thing for which you were hoping.

A great benefits of becoming "more mature" is the ability to better insure you receive what *you* want for Christmas, rather than leaving the matter wholly to Santa's elves; though, certainly, some of the surprise gets diminished in process.

This year I ensured I received *exactly* what I wanted for Christmas: come the morning of Christmas Eve, I hopped into my very own sleigh and drove all over the county delivering caramel corn to the kids of our church (and few "big kids" to boot). Special thanks to Beth Hayes, Julia Basford, Sandy Trimm and Sasha Trimm for making the caramel corn! It simply wouldn't be Christmas on the Park without kids and caramel corn, and if the kids couldn't come to church this year because of COVID, "church" would come to them.

What a delight to see the kids stand at the door (many still in their pajamas) to see their excitement and to appreciate how much they all have grown. It so gladdened my heart, as I knew it would. Though certainly a shorter jaunt than the *real* Santa makes, it took this Santa 4 1/2 hours to deliver over 50 bags to the same number of kids. I was amazed at just how many kids we have in our congregation, and how far flung is this congregation. Though many live right here in the village of Canton (Farmer Street, in particular, is becoming Presbyterian Central) an equal number are scattered throughout the surrounding towns of Rensselaer Falls, Norwood and Potsdam. Impressive!

After all the bags were delivered to the good little girls and boys of the congregation (and they are ALL good) I went to the church to put the remaining bags in the foyer before heading home to my own kids and the Christmas Eve festivities that awaited me there. While there, I checked mail and messages and listened to one on the machine from an obviously teary mom hoping for help to make Christmas possible for her 3 young children. They had taken shelter through Renewal House without much more than the clothes on their back, and with no money and no transportation.

At this point it was almost 4 p.m. and, frankly, I was ready to be done for the day. But, come on, what choice was there? It's Christmas and we're a church. So I made the call. She made arrangements for someone to watch the kids (ages 7, 8 and 9) and I picked up the woman, drove her to Walmart, gave her some money I had tucked away from our Christmas Giving Program for last minute needs (which seem to happen every year, so I've learned to be prepared) waited while she shopped, and drove her back to where she was staying. Suffice to say she was tremendously grateful. It was a Christmas Miracle, all thanks to you in our congregation.

Later that evening, as I sat with feet up in my recliner amid the warmth and joy of my own family and our home, I couldn't help but marvel at the blessing that is our church. From the many kids in our midst, to the care we offer to the community and those in need, to the life you provide to our family; how humbling. Perhaps, more than anything, feeling a sense of humility for all God has done, and is doing, for this world is what Christmas is really all about.

The meeting will automatically begin at 11:30 a.m. & end at 12:45 p.m.)

This will allow everyone the opportunity to follow the liturgy, and see the announcements and prayer requests. Go to <u>www.ChurchOn-ThePark.org</u> and click on "Sunday Bulletin."
