# The Pastor's Report

Now faith is the assurance

of things hoped for,

the conviction

of things not seen.

Warm greetings to all, my brothers and sisters; those who are both near and far.

This month, as we await the Celebration

of Easter and the greening of the earth, I would like to speak to you about hope. Specifically, this passage from Hebrews 11:1, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." If faith is understood as seeing the light at the end of the

tunnel, hope is the warmth that is finally felt as one grows nearer. That is, faith is what leads us to hope.

With all that is going on in the world these days (and there is always *something* going on) many people seek to find hope amid the various sundry challenges, hardships and tragedies of life which confront and befall us. Hope is an easy goal to set, and understandably so.

The ultimate value of one's hope, however, is only ever a function of that upon which one's hope is placed. That is, our faith. One does not find hope without first discovering faith. Hope is a function of faith; and disproportionally so.

As one's faith is eroded, so too is the value of one's hope. It doesn't take very much at all to erode faith and, hence, erase hope. Take, as an example, the erosion of faith in our nation's election system and how easily and eagerly it has been undermined. We receive the hope our faith deserves.

Conversely, though, only a small bit of faith (the size of a mustard seed) is enough to not just move a mountain, but to create a mountain of hope. Such is the power of ideas and ideals; they don't just determine the present, they shape the future.

As we move toward Easter, I would like to suggest that the question we should be asking ourselves is this, "What is the future we wish to shape for ourselves?" Not just as a world and a nation but, more importantly and specifically, as a church

and the people and families which constitute it. The future for which we hope will only ever be arrived at by the faith we might muster. Faith in each other, faith in what our church is now and might be and, finally, faith in the God whose hands are upon us each and every day.

The hope we have for our church is multifold: a source of support, an opportunity for fellowship, a critical component of the nurture and care of our children, a social safety net, the means of living beyond ourselves into a larger life, a chance to make a difference, a bastion of values, a place where *you* and *every* child of God can come to know and accept their intrinsic worth and purpose, and, finally, a home where grace is both found and may abound.

However bold such hopes might be, they all reside in and depend upon the faith we have in the empty tomb of Easter Sunday morning. Our hope will only ever be a function of our faith. Having seen the light, it now beckons us to draw nearer to feel the warmth upon our faces and deep down in our souls.

In the promise and hope of new life in Christ. - Rev. Mike


Started in **1949**, One Great Hour of Sharing is a long-standing **ecumenical effort** aimed at raising the funds necessary to provide **relief** and **reconstruction** for communities in the aftermath of disaster. What started as an hourlong radio appeal has evolved over the years, growing to over **30** participating denominations, and has become the most participated in Offering in the PC(USA).


