The Pastor's Report

Whew! Huh? Life just keeps coming and I'm so glad we are on this ride together my brothers and sisters; both near and far.

Though we reside in the county which has the highest rate of COVID in the state (currently) it does seem we are make our way forward. I wouldn't begin to say that things are anywhere near normal, but I'm not so sure "normal" is necessarily the goal we should have for ourselves; or, at the very least, it shouldn't be our only goal.

Of late, I've been thinking a great deal about pace, about consistency and about cumulative effect. I've also been trying a new paradigm on for size; which has been interesting.

I'm not really sure of the wisdom of saying all of this to you, but being up-front about things has always been my modus operandi and, for the most part, always worked out for the best (and for all parties concerned). For my entire time here in Canton I have operated with the assumption that at some point I would leave here and take another church as my final stopping point prior to retirement (and that I'm even talking about "retirement" is still very much an odd thing to me). I based this assumption not on the tone, shape or quality of our congregation, or of my own life as both are, quite simply, peachy in my estimation. No, this was simply an assumption based on the math.

When Linda and I arrive in Canton, in 1998, I was 33 years old. At that point, objectively, I was looking at 34 working years ahead of me; a tad longer than I'd already spent walking this earth. That is, a lifetime. Frankly, and as those who were



around during that period would surely agree, making it even those first *four* years felt like a stretch. Against all odds and expectations, I've now been here 23 years, and have roughly 10 years to go until retirement. Or, 18% of my current life-time.

Subjectively, it has been my experience that ministers rarely hit the sweet spot in terms of the length of their tenure; either they leave too soon or stay too long. Once the former option became moot, the latter

> has always been my biggest concern; and still is. The issue, therefore, is remaining innovative and energized for the home-stretch.

Linda and I are not the only ones with a vote, though. How all of this

plays out will depend very much on all of you. Given this, I make a standing invitation to each of you to weigh-in if you think it might be best for the church that a change begin to be contemplated. Linda and I want what is best for the church, as this will surely be what is best for us.

Beyond any impossible prognostications about the future, the most important matter that concerns us is the *present*. Frankly, when I stop to look around I'm amazed at how much we have accomplished together over these years. While the flash may have been tempered some, the bang is still very much happening. Lives are being changed, help is being provided, fun is being had, children are growing up know they are loved, and all of us are being supported and accompanied on the journey homeward.

Slow and steady wins the race, Rev. Mike

Surprise!













