The Pastor's Report

And so it begins...again.

Howdy to all you friends and church folk far and wide! September is now upon us, and we begin a new school year and church season. Fortified from summer rest and recreation, we once again turn our attention to the matter at hand: daily living and all that this entails.

Of course, we've all been living our lives each day all summer, but I'm sure you understand the sense we all have at the end of each summer that come September it is time to get back to our "normal" routines and lives.

September always seems to be an opportunity for a fresh start, a reset and, perhaps, a new direction or goal (however modest). Given this, I'd like to "float a balloon" to you as to where we, as a congregation, might like to move ourselves.

One of the greatest challenges I face as a minister is what I term "non-acute pastoral care." That is, getting around to visit folks "just because." Meaning, there is not necessarily a pressing need due to sickness or distress but, rather, the simple desire to say hello, catch up and spend some time together. In any given week, however, it seems as if there is always some urgent need, some task which must be attended to, or some fire to put out. Unfortunately, this leaves little time for me to amble over and sit a spell with folks. Having said that, I recently had the opportunity to spend a little time with a few people and it got me to thinking.

One of the most difficult things for me, and I assume this to be the case for everyone, is

how easily we can see the world in which we live from the pace at which we are living it and conclude there isn't whole lot we can do beyond holding on tight and, if we are lucky, enjoy the ride even a little bit every once and a while. In the big picture, there really isn't much we an do to change the world. This past month, however, I have come to see this isn't necessarily true.

Last week I had occasion to drive Betsy Robinson down to Syracuse for a medical appointment. I realized when I offered to do this that it would take a big bite out of my week. I also realized, though, that the opportunity to spend 5 hours in a car with a beloved church member who is in their 90s is a limited time offer. On the way home, I suggested we stop at the Good Golly diner in Central Square for coffee and a bite to eat. Betsy deferred saying, "Don't you have to get back?" I answered, "Betsy, this is what I'm doing today; let's stop." So we did. I had a couple of egg sandwiches for a late lunch, filled my travel mug with much needed coffee

for the ride home and Betsy, out of the blue, decided to order a root beer float; a real treat right out of her childhood, or so she claimed (and so it seemed from watching her enjoy it). While it was a rather short respite from our drive, it was simply wonderful to share each other's company and a simple treat. A gift we gave to ourselves and each other.

As we ramp back up for a new school year and season at the church, I'd like to suggest that one of the best things we can do for ourselves and those in our congregation, is to make time to do some things we don't necessarily have to: share our lives with each other.


