Happy New Year everyone! Before we ring in the new, however, great thanks for making the previous year so wonderful for our church.

Thanks to those who made December so special: to our Christian Education Director Andrea Montgomery, Choir Director Jarrett Larson, the members of the Choir, all those who helped with the Greening of the Church, leading worship, baking cookies, the Deacons for delivering poinsettias and cookies, contributing to the potluck and, especially, to all of the kids of our church for their most excellent Christmas Pageant. What fun it was to see the kids singing, speaking and grinning ear to ear!

A heart-felt thank you to all the folks who made a pledge, and to all of you who support the church with or without making a pledge. Our Stewardship Drive is on target and we will move into the new year on a solid fiscal footing. Thanks to those living near, and those living far away, for your financial support of our church.

I am extremely humbled by the great outpouring of donations to fund our annual Christmas Giving Program.

Through gifts made to the Deacons, the Mission Budget, the Pentecost, One Great Hour of Sharing and Farm Family Offerings, Pastor's Discretionary Fund as well as individual gifts made to the church for this purpose, we were able to provide over \$8,500 to 56 families in our community. Your generosity is humbling, and inspiring. Thanks also to

Marilyn Rodee for her leadership in making the Farm Family Offering happen.

Particular to thank the congregation for the "spiritual durability" it has shown these past few years through COVID. Sometimes the notion of what a church really is gets lost in what we assume a church should be. Make no mistake, in being who we are, we have accepted a daunting challenge to truly place the Gospel at the heart of our faith community. We are an incredibly diverse group of people in just about every way: theologically, socially, politically and in terms of stage of life; and yet, the center holds. I appreciate the efforts of each one of you in finding your place here, and supporting others as they too find their place. People often ask me, "What can we do to save/change the world?" I think the first step is for us to ensure that our church is healthy, authentic and growing in depth of purpose. The rest, in all the beautiful and creative forms it may take, will surely follow. Christmas Giving Recap

Great thanks to the entire congregation, and friends both near and far, for your tremendous generosity this year in supporting our annual Christmas Giving Program; especially the response to the Farm Family Offering. This year, our church was able to distribute \$8.500 of Christmas cheer to **56 families** here in Canton and the surrounding area which includes \$2,200 for Farm Families, \$4,000 for families with school-age children as well as a host of others including a family who lost their home to fire, and in purchasing biblical reference books for the chaplain's ministry at Bare Hill prison in Malone. Begun in 2002, over the past 20 years our annual Christmas Giving Program has provided over \$133k to hundreds of families at Christmas. We are an amazing congregation with glad and generous hearts!
