### The Pastor's Report

Oh goody, goody, goody it is March! Which means...Spring is only three weeks away. We've got a full slate of church activities planned straight through Easter with which we can enjoy and engage ourselves (Women's Worship, All-Church Read, Ham Dinner, Palm Sunday Potluck and Procession and Easter week). We are also transitioning to a new Direc-

tor for the Choir and (hopefully) new pianist. The game, and the Spirit, are both afoot here on the Park.

This month I would like to talk a little bit about membership, as we have quite a few people who are at a point in their own faith journey where they are interested in, and exploring what it

means to "officially" join the church.

Of course, even getting to such a point necessarily means one has *already* "joined" the church in almost every way that matters: fellowship, worship, mission and the offering of time, talent and treasure. None of these require one's name to be written in some book. That said, membership that is "official" does matter. It certainly matters to our church, particularly with regard to folks being able to serve in direct leadership posi-

tions as a Deacon or Elder. It matters most, though, to those individuals who might become members. As a pastor, it is a fine line to walk and one I do not push because what is meant to be an act of inclusion can sometimes be the very thing that creates feelings of exclusion. Which, of course, is exactly the opposite of the intended goal and purpose.

Amid these considerations I cannot help but bring to mind the old Groucho Marx quote, "I don't care to belong to any club that will accept me as a member." Funny, and cleverly insightful, right? However, with regard to this particular club (that is, the church) it is more a

matter if the person will have *them-selves* as a member of the club.

After great thought over a span of many years, I've come to realize that becoming an "official" member of the church is mostly about belief and responsibility: do we believe enough in this particular group of people as the body of Christ that we would claim responsibility for it, just as it claims responsibility for us?


#### Read All About It - The All-Church Read

Bishop, her thoughtful act starts a chain reaction that multiplies around the world. Mrs. Bishop makes blueberry muffins and gives them to her paperboy and four



A small girl is sent to live with foster



how fragile her idyll is. More than most books four times its size, *Foster* does several of the things we ask of great literature: It expands our world, diverting our attention outward, and it opens up our hearts and minds. This is a small book with a miraculously outsized impact.
