

Well, we MADE it; congratulations! Spring has sprung, and with Easter right around the corner, warm(er) weather is sure to follow (have faith).

This month I am looking at things from a bit of a strange angle, so please bear with me. The past few weeks at the church have been nothing short of inspiring, marvelous and remarkable. I have to tell you, from a personal and professional perspective I am having a *ball* being the minister.

By way of illustration, I arrived at church this past Sunday to find the fire alarm going off; and, holy cow, was it LOUD. It was a very *inauspicious* start to the day. Thankfully, there was no real issue and everything resolved (somewhat) quickly.

Later that afternoon, as is our habit, Linda and I were talking about the day's events and all the things happening at our church: 90 some people in worship between in-person and live-stream, all the kids gathered around me as I read to them, the hustle and bustle of the Ham Dinner. the great many hands on deck to put on the meal (particularly the kids) and how so many folks are stepping up to BE the church. All of this right on the heels of the prior week's Celebrate the Gifts of Women Sunday which was nothing short of inspirational (just take a look at the photo on page 13 of all the women and girls of the church there that day). There is a real and powerful energy at work in our church these days. Folks feel at home; and *that* is saying something.

It wasn't until later that evening that I even remembered how the day had begun with the fire alarm going off and the Fire Department pulling a truck up to the front of the church. Think about that. So many *good* things are happening, that I couldn't even bring to mind the bad. Said another way, the usual outpaced the *un*usual. Which is...unusual.

Next up is Palm Sunday (and I'm already looking forward to the potluck breakfast we'll be having with the folks from Grace Episcopal) which will usher in the start to Holy Week culminating at Easter. Though there is much which must and should be said on the occasion of Easter, it occurs to me that what transpired this past Sunday at our church is a message we often miss about Easter: through Christ, God has brought so much good into the world that the bad pales in comparison if not forgotten and left behind all together. With God, the unusual becomes our usual.

Looking for an example of new life through Christ and the power of the Cross and empty tomb to change the world? Look no further than the Church on the Park. Right on!


