The Pastor's Report

Greetings this month, Sisters and Brothers, as we are all swept up and carried along with the greening and flowering of the earth.

Walking over to the church on this spring day, I was quite taken by how exuberant, green and verdant is the Park. Then, as I made the turn up the sidewalk to the foyer, I realized that our church is so much the same these days. There is a newness to our life together. Our congregation feels to me as a green canopy spreading out with lushness and a heft without heaviness; and, sprinkled throughout, buds bursting forth into flower all supple, fragrant and fertile.

Clearly, the Spirit of God is upon this place. Frankly, it is humbling. But, as my my pony-tail gives me ample license, I am always prone to a tinge of paranoia; or, at the least, a wariness. Not about any bad thing which might be waiting to befall but, rather, that the "other shoe" which will surely drop is God calling us to some vast task; almost certainly some form of mission endeavor which probably isn't even yet on our radar.

Whatever that might be, though, is a matter for another day. For this day, I would like to address and affirm what I believe are the three characteristics which have brought us to the very blessed place: permeability, expansiveness and essentiality.

Permeability is the ability to allow for things, people and ideas to flow both inward (hospitality, access and belonging) and outward (mission, leadership/action beyond ourselves); while, at the same time, in no way compromising structural integrity.

Expansiveness is resisting (or revolting/rebelling against) the limitation others, the culture and our society may place on us or, more formidably, the limits we might place on ourselves. That is, making real-life decisions about our time, talent and treasure based not on our own sensibilities (or those of others) but on that which God has deemed possible (doubtful though we may sometimes be). Expansiveness is about boldness, courage and determination.

Essentiality is focusing on what really matters, and actively dismissing or, at the very least, unburdening ourselves from that which does not. This requires a level of astuteness in recognizing what is most important, an intentionality about staying on task, and an honesty filled with self-forgiveness about the (very) many things we must either forgo, or distance ourselves from, or an acceptance of how much is simply too much. None of us can do it all. Mercifully, we don't have to. So, let us be gentle with ourselves.

as they host many out-oftown friends and family at a dinner that evening (it is a college graduation weekend, so restaurants are booked). If you would like to provide a casserole




