



The Pastor's Report

Folks, after 25 years in Canton I have been extended the honor of serving as the guest speaker at this year's Memorial Day service held on Monday May 29th at 11 a.m. in the Park. For this month's Pastor's Report, I would like to share with you my comments from that occasion:

It is my great privilege today to gather with you as a community to honor those from our community who gave their lives in sacrifice to our nation, and to honor all the men and women from across this great land, our fellow citizens who, as President Lincoln stated in his Gettysburg Address, "gave their last full measure of devotion that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom. that government of the

people, by the people and for the people, shall not perish from this earth."

On that occasion, President Lincoln also called upon our nation and its citizenry to take from these honored dead an increased devotion to the cause for which their last full measure was given.

While we gather on this Memorial Day so that we shall ever remember those who gave such a sacrifice, we also gather here today to increase *our* devotion to the very same altar on which they laid their very lives.

That we find ourselves here this morning is, in part, owed to Mary Ann Williams from Baldwin

County Georgia who, in a

simple and courageous act, penned a letter to her local newspaper in March of 1866 suggesting a day be set aside annually to keep alive the debt owed those Civil War soldiers, Union and Confederate, who died in that terrible conflict

by at *least* dedicating one day in each year to what she called "the sad, but pleasant duty of embellishing their humble graves with flowers." By 1890 every

state in the Union had established some form of annual observance and, in 1971, Congress standardized the holiday as "Memorial Day" to be held the last Monday in May; an occasion for our entire nation to pause our lives in order to remember *all* those in *every* generation who have died in service to our nation that we might forever remain the land of the free and the home of the brave.

This morning, 157 years after the publication of Mrs. Williams' letter, it becomes *our* sad, but pleasant duty to stand together as one community and as one nation, to honor and remember all those who offered to our country, and to each one of us, her citizens, their last full measure of devotion.

It is my great hope today that we might exhibit the same wisdom and simple courage as Mrs. Williams who stood amid the graves of too many Civil War soldiers and saw buried there, not Northerners or Southerners, but each one a fellow American called to serve their nation; even a nation divided.

It both troubles me greatly and saddens me deeply that we are, once again, becoming such a divided nation; too eager to seize upon those things about which we differ rather than holding sacred all that we share and hold in common as citizens of our one nation.

While those we honor today may have begun their service in devotion to God and country, their *greatest* devotion was reserved for those who served, fought and died along side of them; regardless of color, race, creed or political belief. Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.

If it is our earnest desire to *truly* honor those who have died for our nation let us use the new birth of freedom they have won us to increase our own devotion to those who labor, love and *live* along side of us; regardless of color, race, creed or political belief. The greatest commandment is to love God with all one's heart and with all one's soul; and to love one's neighbor as oneself. For we are all citizens of the same nation; of the people, by the people and for the people.

More than a responsibility it is our great privilege to live *our* lives at the very same altar on which they laid *their* very lives: that we are *one* nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all. Thank you.





Session Report

The Session met on **Monday**, **April 24th**. A thank you note from the Dailey
Ridge Church was shared for a recent donation from our church.

Greeting Elders and the Greeting of Our Neighbors will return as part of the worship service. New members will be welcomed to the church on April 30th and again in June (total of 16). Rev. Meigs Ross filled the pulpit while Rev. Mike was on vacation recently and the response was very positive.

The memorial service for Bill Rodee will be on May 13th and casseroles are needed to feed the **Rodee family** and friends on May 12th. Several session members volunteered to provide food.

Rev. Mike shared that he had met with the Canton Mayor and Chief of Police about the possibility of a **SRO** at Canton Central. All three will be attending the upcoming School Board meeting to discuss this and invite others to be part of the conversation.

There will be an **ordination** for new elders and deacons May 28th. Volunteers stepped forward to be with Karen Parker while Bill has surgery in Burlington on May 8th. **Mother's Day** and **Father's Day** brunches were discussed with plans to hold these after worship. The last day of Sunday School will be **June 18th**.

Joe Montgomery reported he has looked into grants and donations for the AED. Michelle Theisen reported that donations, monetary and food items, are needed for Church & Community as the demand is high. Jim Franklin reported that \$5,000 was transferred to the treasure on the Faith Line to pay bill. If needed, this amount can be transferred each quarter.



Community Conversation

Rev. Mike, in cooperation with the Canton Mayor Michael Dalton and Police Chief James Santimaw and with the Session's unanimous support, will be inviting anyone from the Canton School District who is concerned about the health, safety and well-being of the children in our schools to attend a Community Conversation on Tuesday, June 13th at 7 p.m. to be held in the sanctuary of our church in order to gauge support, or the absence thereof, for possibly re-instituting the School Resource Officer (SRO) position at the Canton Central

School. There will be no agenda, and a "light touch" is intended. The goal is to simply give people the opportunity to respectfully speak not only their minds, but also their



hearts; and to listen to others who wish to do the same. Rev. Mike would ask for prayers for this important, and somewhat daring, venture.


