AED Grant Received

Great thanks to the Northern New York Community Foundation for providing a \$2,000 grant for the purchase and signage for an AED, or Automated External Defibrillator, which is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet easy-to-use, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.

Kudos to Elder **Heidi Ames** for writing the grant application, and her leadership in this endeavor. Along with the purchase cost and installation, part of the grant will be used for signs in the Park to inform people of its existence and location in the event it is needed during events in the Park such as Farmers' Market and Dairy Princess. Thanks to Elders Heidi and **Joe Montgomery** for their current efforts to select, purchase and install the AED and appropriate signage.

CCP Report

In May, the Church and Community Program served **187** households with **91** children, **183** adults and **107** seniors. Of these, **11** households were new, and they served **5** emergency food/displaced people cases.

Thanks to everyone for their continued support of the program, which is a significant part of our church's local mission. Donations for the food pantry are always welcome and needed.

Grief Support Group

Hospice of St. Lawrence Valley will be hosting *Navigating Grief Together*, a **six-week** support group, in **Massena** for those grieving any type of loss.

Navigating Grief Together is designed to provide a supportive space in which members can **learn** about grief, **discuss** their unique experiences, and **empower** each other to grieve in a healthy and effective manner that works for them. Each week the group will explore a **different topic** related to grief including acute grief, how grief can be emotional and physical, ideas for coping, and how to create an enduring connection with the person who died, if appropriate.

People who would benefit from this group include those grieving a loss that occurred at least six months ago. This is not a therapeutic support group but rather a **social support group** for adults in the community already working on their grief.




