The Pastor's Report

Greetings Sisters and Brothers in the faith; those near or far, but always close at heart!

As you know, this is the time of year when we undertake our annual Stewardship Drive. As such, it is a time of taking stock, compiling figures and crunching numbers all with the hope that we can continue building on the financial strength of our church as we move into the future.

As you might guess, and as I have shared in the past, I'm not really a "math person." But I do enjoy numbers as they relate to measurements; particularly as they involve building and woodworking. There is something very honest and straightforward about numbers, particularly as a means of measurement.

This past week I officiated at the funeral of an "old feller" from the Canton community. The title of my homily was "The Measure of a Person's Life." The point I made to those gathered is that the measure of our lives is not what *we* do but, rather, what God does *for* us.

That said, this got me to thinking about the measure of a church. Certainly, we can understand the scope and direction of our church in looking at the dollars and cents, as this is an inescapable reality of our life together as a church family. Those numbers, the financial numbers, only tell part of the tale. To give a fuller sense of who we are and what we do, I would like to throw a few more numbers at you:

6. The number of Elders on the Session with school-aged kids.

17 and 5. That is, 17 people joined the church this year and we baptized 5 infants to welcome them into the body of Christ and this faith community.

64 and 33. The first is the average number of folks attending worship each Sunday in-person (64) and the second the average number of people worshiping via the live-stream (33). I am enough of a math person to know that adding these two numbers together means that on any given Sunday we have about 100 people worshipping here at our church.

One final number I would offer is "everyone." I would invite you to take a look at the photo pages from our recent Fall Bazaar included in this month's newsletter. When I first received these photos something leapt right out at me: *everyone* is smiling. To me, this is an extremely important measure of a church: the joy we feel, and the joy we share.

Here at our Church, *everyone* counts and we count on *all* of us.

Go figure, Rev. Mike

At Rev. Mike's invitation, **Waltha-Gaye Leavitt** will deliver the sermon on Sunday, **November 12th** (Rev. Mike will lead worship). WalthaGaye is a child of our church, and the daughter of **Carolyn Leavitt** (who died this past summer) and we joyously welcome her home to the Church on the Park, and to hear her sermon entitled, *"How Did I Get Here?"* Below is a short bio:

I was born to Carolyn Harriet Cutter Leavitt from Washington Mills, NY and Lester Clark Leavitt of North Russell, NY. Mother was an English teacher and taught High School English at Brushton High School. Father was also a teacher and taught at St. Lawrence Ag School which became ATC and then SUNY. His major was soil science but his minor was English. My mother taught school long enough to know that she wanted unusual names for her children. My name is a derivative of Walter- my grandfather. My mother's sister put the Gaye on it to make it "flow".

I went to school at Canton and graduated in 1974 in a class of 130, by the skin of my teeth. I was active in 4-H and in the St. Lawrence 4-H County Club. Music was important to me – I took piano lessons for many years and played bassoon in the band. I was a member of this church- active in the choir, Youth Fellowship and the Ad Board.

After high school graduation, I went to Nursing School at the St. Lawrence Psychiatric Center in Ogdensburg. It was a 3 year program and we were encouraged to live in the dorms. I was home most weekends to go to church and to care for my horse.

After graduating college, I moved to Michigan to start my career of 31 years. There wasn't a Presbyterian Church in

Carson City so I joined the United Methodist Church. I taught Sunday School for 31 years. When I took a job on days at the hospital, I became more active at church serving on committees. I earned my BSN from Ferris State University in 1991. I found that I loved to learn and so took classes for Lay Speaking. I also became active in the United Methodist Women which is now called United Women in Faith.

I retired from Nursing in 2017 but find many activities to keep me busy. Recently, I help the Lutheran Church on their quilting days. We make utility quilts that are sent around the world through Lutheran World Relief. I also work weekly at IM 3rd mead which makes a nutritious bag lunch for food insecure children.

Some suggestions are canned goods with "pop-top easy-open" lids of canned fruit, vegetables, soup, canned meats/tuna, bottled juice, peanut butter, jam, crackers, cereal, pasta/rice, spaghetti sauce. Our non-perishable food inventory is monitored and any food items expiring within 3 months of expiration will be taken to the Church & Community Food Pantry for distribution.

People in great need can be referred to the **Church & Community Program**, 30 Court Street, Canton, M - F, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The CCP Food Pantry is officially open on Tuesdays from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. and on Wednesdays from noon to 3:30 p.m. They make food deliveries to community clients signed up for the food pantry assistance Mon-Wed. each week.


