The Pastor's Report

Welcome February!

It is always amazing to me how February, more than any other month of the year, is so fraught with hopeful expectation. While it may be *just* February, it means that we've survived the long slog that is January and now, seemingly, spring is finally on the way if not yet around the corner. All this is to say that how we look at things depends very much on where we are standing.

This month I would like to speak to the issue of where we currently stand with the children and young families of, and in our church. For so long our church, like just about every

other church, has sought to welcome kids, youth and their families. Such a posture is to be expected as we recognize, intellectually, that among these children and parents lies the future of our church (and any/every church).

In many ways, however, this new place where we find ourselves standing is *completely* new ground: namely, that we have a *plethora* of families with school-aged children who call the Church on the Park their spiritual home. This as exciting as it is remarkable, and a real tribute to this congregation working slowly, but doggedly, to create a welcoming space for young families. Metaphorically, we have survived the "January" time in the history of our church and look expectedly to a lovely and life-restoring spring. Now comes the tricky part: what to do with these kids now that they are here? The most immediate answer is, "more"; the specifics of this, however, have yet to come into focus. They will, however, because they *must*. To start moving us down this road a bit, I'd like to make an observation and, then, a request.

My observation is that is it increasingly and stunningly challeng-

> ing to raise a family. There are so many forces at work in society, both overt and subtle, that line-up against children and young parents these days that the church must be THE place they can come to for support, encouragement and guidance. Moreover, as a church we

must relearn, or learn anew, *how* to help families meet these challenges because, frankly, we've fallen out of practice and, in some ways, out of touch.

Now the request. Having closed on the sale of the Selleck land and with funds available for the creation of a room *specifically* for the kids and youth of our church, we begin to consider what this space will be; both in form and function. We are starting a small working committee to explore what the *kids* would like, as well as what parents desire. I would ask everyone to start to imagine what you think we should do. As my mother always said, "Raising children is the hardest job you'll ever love." We've got the love, now let's get going on the work; for this generation and those to follow. - Rev. Mike

All-Church ReadS!

For this year's All-Church Read, we are going to dig a little deeper and try something new in selecting **THREE** books all with the same theme of *seeing people and being seen by others, and learning to listen and ask better questions.* Given this, we are getting an early start on gifting and sharing these selections.

Owing to the number of kids in our church, and the wide age range they represent, we feel it is important to try to meet kids "where they are at." The **younger kids will be receiving a copy of Noticing**, written by Kobi Yamada and illustrated by Elise Hurst, "This is a story about noticing the little things, the grand big things, the imaginary, and sometimes, hidden things. It is about embracing what's possible. The incredible is everywhere, and in everything - waiting to be known, discovered and recognized."

"Tweeners" and older teens will receive a copy of Jerry Spinelli's <u>Stargirl.</u> "After 15 years of home schooling, Stargirl bursts into tenth grade in an explosion of color and a clatter of ukulele music, enchanting the Mica student body. 


