Having closed on the sale of the land, steps are now being taken (thanks to Joe **Montgomery**) to sort and and store decades worth of church school supplies and costumes in preparation of a remodel for the "Selleck Room" for use by the children and use by our church. In this regard, we've had a change of plans **about location**. The Pastor's Report

Howdy folks!

As we move into March, we also move into the midst of the ecclesiastical season of Lent, or as it also known: The Easter Cycle. This month I though I'd give a little history on this unique aspect of our faith.

Easter is the oldest and greatest annual festival of the church. Like Passover with the Jews, it originally marked the beginning of the church year. It revolves entirely about the person and the work of Christ, being devoted to the great saving fact of his passion and resurrection.

The Easter festival proper was preceded by a forty days' season of repentance and fasting, called Quadragesima. This fast was an imitation of the forty days' fasting of Jesus in the wilderness, which itself was put in typical connection with the forty days' fasting of Moses and Elijah, and the forty years' wandering of Israel through the desert. At first a free-will act, it gradually assumed the character of a fixed custom and ordinance of the church. Pope Gregory I set the Wednesday of the sixth week before Easter, Ash Wednesday as it is called, as the beginning of it. On this day the priests and the people sprinkled themselves with dust and ashes, in token of their perishableness and their repentance, with the words: "Remember, O man/woman, that dust thou art, and unto dust thou must return; repent, that thou mayest inherit eternal life." ¹

The English word *Lent* (stems from an Anglo-Saxon word for "spring" and is related to the English

word lengthen) refers to the penitential period preceding Easter. Early Christians felt that the magnitude of the Easter celebration called for special preparation. In the early centuries, the season before Easter was also the usual period of intense training for new Christians. During this period, the catechumens (those learning what it meant to be Christians) went through the final stages of preparation for Baptism, which usually occurred at dawn on Easter Sunday. As the practice of infant baptism increased, the emphasis on Lent as a training period decreased. ²

Here on the Park, we certainly incorporate many of these traditional aspects of Lent into our life and worship. However, instead of the notion of "giving something up" for Lent, we've tried to focus on "taking something on" for Lent. And, as Lent falls toward the end of our harsh winters (penance enough if you ask me!) we've also infused the season with moments of unique celebration: our annual "All-Church Read," Celebrate The Gifts of Woman Sunday, and while we are going to take a break this year from our annual triumphant march around the Park on Palm Sunday (owing to the inability of our brothers and sisters at Grace Episcopal Church to participate) we will still be having a brunch on Palm Sunday; though after worship rather than before.

Blessings to you this season of Lent, Rev. Mike

For this year's All-Church Read, we are going to dig a little deeper and try something new in selecting THREE books all with the same theme of seeing people and being seen by others, and learning to listen and ask better questions. Given this, we are getting and early start on gifting and sharing these selections. Books are currently being distributed to families and, somehow, Rev. Mike will be pulling together all three of these books as part of the sermon on **Sunday March 17th**, All-Church Read Sunday.

Owing to the number of kids in our church, and the wide age range they represent, we feel it is import to try to meet kids "where they are at." The **younger kids (20) will be receiving a copy of**Noticing, written by Kobi Yamada and illustrated by Elise Hurst, "This is a story about noticing the little things, the grand big things, the imaginary, and sometimes, hidden things. It is about embracing what's possible. The incredible is everywhere, and in everything - waiting to be known, discovered and recognized."


